

Did you know?

- 1 in 3 women has experienced physical violence by an intimate partner. (CDC)
- Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women more than car accidents, muggings and rapes combined.
 (CDC)
- Over 50% of homeless women are homeless due to domestic violence. (NCFH)
- 3 top lethality risks: ending the relationship, gun ownership and coercive control. (Evan Stark, PhD)
- Up to 60% of domestic violence relationships also involve child maltreatment. (CDF)
- Childhood exposure to domestic violence increases the risk of adult mental and physical health consequences ranging from anxiety and depression to diabetes, heart disease, alcoholism and suicide. (CDC)

Our Mission

WomenSV is an educational center focused on educating survivors, providers and the community at large about more subtle forms of abuse that don't always leave forensic evidence behind but can still be dangerous, even life-threatening.

We empower survivors, train providers and educate the community to break the cycle of covert abuse and coercive control in intimate partner relationships.

We also help survivors address more subtle forms of coercive control, including financial, legal, technological and emotional abuse. Our unique program has evolved to meet the growing needs of survivors not only in our community but across the United States, with a focus not only on educating survivors but also the systems meant to serve and protect them.

In the past 13 years, WomenSV has served over 1,400 survivors.

Domestic violence can happen in any neighborhood. The power and control dynamics are the same across income levels. However, the power, money and influence of a sophisticated abuser can make it difficult for a survivor to escape, avoid crippling debt and maintain custody of her children. This pattern of threatening, isolating, controlling behavior does not always rise to the level of police intervention, yet it can still cause tremendous damage to the entire family.

We offer our services pro bono because financial abuse is rampant in this demographic. At WomenSV, we believe that regardless of socioeconomic background, it is everyone's fundamental human right to live free and safe in their own home, and they shouldn't have to pay to exercise that right. We therefore rely on donations to sustain our program.



What are some of the more subtle forms of abuse?

Financial

Abusers often take complete control of joint finances, hiding assets, limiting access to funds and taking measures to destroy their partner's credit and career.



Legal

The legal system is often used to continue the abuse even after a woman has decided to leave the relationship. Abusers often drag their partners through the legal system, filing an unending stream of lawsuits, custody battles and even false protection orders against their partners.



Technological

The technology we use in our daily lives can become a weapon in the hands of tech-savvy abusers who digitally stalk their partners, track their movements. send harassing messages or impersonate their partners online.



Emotional

Abuse does not need to be physical to cause lasting damage. Verbal abuse, intimidation, manipulation, constant criticism and gaslighting all allow an abuser to maintain power and control over their partners causing them to walk on eggshells, live in fear and even question their own perspectives, memory and sanity.
